#### Are any of these reasons keeping you away from the Sacrament of Reconciliation this Lent?

**Fear:** Fear is always the opposite of faith. But, what am I afraid of? God? My sin? Admitting that I am not perfect?

A lack of a true sense of sinfulness: It is fair to say that in our culture people have lost a "sense of sinfulness." Any wrong I do can be blamed on something or someone else like my parents, another person, circumstances beyond my control, or a bad experience.

An undeveloped or immature sense of sin:

When an adult confesses the same things they did as a child, ("I missed my morning prayers," "I had a bad thought," "I got angry") it indicates that their faith and/or their sense of sin has not matured. As a result, confession seems silly or ineffective to a reflective adult so they stop going.

A lack of real awareness of sin: People say things like, "I don't murder or rob banks or anything like that so I don't know what to confess" (as if murder and bank robbery were the only real sins.) or "I'm too old to sin." (as if sin were age-restricted) All of us can and do sin.

**Scrupulosity:** This unhealthy and incessant examination of my life, seeing sin where there is in fact no sin or confessing sins that have been already forgiven is not

healthy. It keeps me from having an appropriate and healthy relationship with God, the God that Jesus reveals. It also keeps me from appreciating God's great gift of life, faith and mercy in a healthy way.

**Inability and/or unwillingness to forgive others who have hurt or betrayed us:** Jesus put it best in the "Lord's Prayer:" "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." If I will not forgive others and appreciate its value for my life and happiness, then the experience of forgiveness by God will be lost on me.

**Pride:** Guilt and shame never "feel" good and so sometimes I am too proud to admit that I have sinned. I stay away because it is too hard to admit my sin to God or another human person. If we wait until it is easy to do, we will never celebrate this sacrament.

**A bad experience of the sacrament:** Being yelled at or demeaned in confession can readily turn people away from it. A priest in confession is supposed to reflect God's love and mercy as Jesus did or else he is abusing the sacrament and those who come to receive it. No one should tolerate such an attitude.


