

Divine Mercy Sunday

At Easter we experience God's mercy at its most MASSIVE! God shares God's very life with us, a life which overcomes even our own death! Can you think of any greater gift? God must really love us, right?

Isn't it interesting, though, that this massive gift is given in the dark and quiet of what certainly seemed, to the disciples, to be an ordinary beginning to a new week.

In the same way, Easter changes us profoundly with the promise of our own resurrection. And then time goes on, and we go about our business with the same, ordinary activities. We still have the bills to pay, the pains that plague us, the politics that irritate us, and the temptations that continue to push their way under our radar, bringing with them their dark corruption.

I think that's why we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday on the Second Sunday of Easter. God's great mercy must seep through, deep into the ordinary or our lives. We are not yet risen, but we have a sure and certain hope. We may be physically infirm, mentally suffering or spiritually deficient, so we all stand in need of God's tender ministrations.



This weekend, our faith community celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday by offering the Anointing of the Sick at all masses. The sick and infirm are invited, through this special sacrament, to place themselves again, wholly into God's care. And with them, the entire community prays and raises up our own needs for healing, knowing that we all depend on God's mercy—God's constant desire for our deep well-being.

The Easter Season is a time of jubilation like no other! We rejoice in our share of God's life and are called to open ourselves more and more fully to God's life, by humbly embracing our deep need for Divine Mercy.

In May, 2007, Rich lost his wife Eileen after her three-year battle against colon cancer, leaving him a single parent of their only child, 14-year-old, Meghan. Six years later in December 2013, Meghan was killed in a hit-and-run accident. In the years since, Rich has had to come to terms with the loss of his family and finding a new path forward. Rich hopes that his experiences, though admittedly painful, will offer the audience a chance to gain insight into how one can face grief and loss and still live a full life, honoring those we have loved and lost.

"Friendly Visitor" ministry began years ago at Midd-South Catholic to bring Christian companionship to those who may be lonely or simply need someone to talk to. An outgrowth of Stephen Ministry, Friendly Visitors visit with the homebound or those in a skilled care facility, talking away the hour, playing cards, making music-whatever the "friend" would like. They also might visit stay-at-home moms who long for adult conversation. Friendly Visitors do not relieve

GIFT Registration Weekend April 27th & 28th - after all Masses

Forms available online and at both campus locations.

GIFT Registration begins this month. GIFT "Growing in faith together" is for everyone starting at age 6-106! Faith formation is lifelong and for every stage of life. Student and Adult sessions are offered.

The G.I.F.T. program is the primary Faith Formation program in our parish. G.I.F.T. Growing in Faith Together is for everyone ages 6-106! Faith learning is lifelong and this catechetical model seeks to engage parents, as the primary educators of faith in the household, on their personal and family faith journeys. With adult (one or both parents/guardian register with child) and student sessions that combine with all ages gatherings; GIFT builds community, forms and informs at all age levels. Through G.I.F.T. sessions, Sunday worship, participation in parish life and service and at home prayer and sharing, families grow in faith and help build a vibrant church.

There are six sessions per year offered at different times and days to accommodate busy schedules. First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation preparation is done in additional workshops and commitments. Enrollment in grades 3-8 is required prior to Confirmation. Once registered in GIFT you will be mailed a packet with workshop and Sacrament celebration dates.

A Haiti Update from Medicines for Humanity (MFH) who partners with our Haiti Ministry to run the clinic in Grand Boulage.

Dear Midd-South Parish,

I hope you had a wonderful Easter! Kristen (MFH's Executive Director) is on vacation this week, but I am happy to share a few positive updates with you.

I am thrilled to let you know that since the Grand Boulage clinic reopened on March 18th, there have not been any security incidents. In fact, the clinic has been extremely busy! The first week it opened for four days, Monday through Thursday, and saw 116 patients! This is more than three times the number of patients seen the week before the clinic shut down in February. Last week, the clinic was open for three days and completed 60 patient visits. These numbers demonstrate how much the community relies on our services at the Grand Boulage clinic!

I also want to let you know that Dusson St. John (MFH's In-country coordinator) continues to maintain close communication with Pe Roland, and he spoke with him today (1 April). Pe Roland reports that he plans to reopen the school next week on Monday, April 8th.

Sacred Heart Campus Next drop off: Apr 9 & 23rd 7:30am - 4pm




